Guidelines for Requesting MIDUS Refresher ARTS Survey Data

The Arts project surveyed members of the MIDUS Refresher National and Milwaukee samples via a mailed Self-Administered Questionnaire (SAQ) to measure their participation in cultural, leisure and hobby activities during the previous 12-month period.

ARTS Survey is a supplemental MIDUS project. Funding for the project was provided by a grant from the University of Wisconsin Madison Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research and Graduate Education (UW-Madison OVCRGE). Therefore, they are not released publicly as other MIDUS project data.

Researchers interested in the ART survey data can request access by submitting a letter to the MIDUS PI Carol Ryff (cryff@wisc.edu). Please also cc Jieun Song (jieunsong@wisc.edu) and Linzhu Tian (ltian2@wisc.edu) on those requests.

The letter should include the following:

- 1. The purposes for which the data are requested (scientific questions) and the investigators involved.
- 2. Who will have access to the data. This is particularly important as these data are not in the public domain.
- 3. Assurances that the following steps will be taken to protect participant confidentiality:
 - a. No attempt will be made to identify individual respondents for any purpose, any such attempt will void permission to use the data.
 - b. In addition, any findings made available to the public (i.e., publications, reports, working papers) will present data at the aggregate level. The following guidelines will be employed when producing tabulations for distribution:
 - i. Magnitude Data: Ensure that no cells/strata with n < 10 are produced.
 - ii. Frequency Data: Apply a marginal threshold of $n \ge 10$ and cell threshold of $n \ge 10$ to all tabulations.
 - iii. Protecting against deductive disclosure: Additional cells may be suppressed to make sure that an individual's identity cannot be discerned due to integration of multiple data sources.
